□27.	Does the single point of contact have the A/B/C forms and release forms of the participants on the outing? (in case the they need to be faxed to EMS)
□28.	Outing Leader or some other adult on trip has a Standard First Aid/CPR/AED Card. BSA Wilderness & Remote First Aid required for High Adventure Bases.
□29.	Outing Leader or other adult on trip has completed a BSA Council Basic Backpack Awareness Course.
□30.	Any special equipment needed for this outing - i.e., snowshoes, climbing rope, ice ax, etc.
□31.	No one on the hike is carrying or has firearms, drugs or alcoholic beverages in his or her possession unless specifically required for their profession or required for a medical reason.
